13 - 26 JANUARY 2021

ALL FEDERAL TERRITORIES (KUALA LUMPUR, PUTRAJAYA, LABUAN), PENANG, JOHOR, MALACCA, SELANGOR AND SABAH

## MAJLIS KESELAMATAN NEGARA GENERAL STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

### PERMITTED ACTIVITIES

Only 2 persons per household may leave the house to purchase basic and daily necessities from nearby supermarkets or grocery shops within a 10km radius unless the supply of necessity is not within the said radius.



Students and candidates sitting for SPM in 2020 and 2021, STPM, SVM, STAM, SKM, DVM, Assessment Admission to Special Schools (for Form 1 and Form 4) and equivalent international examinations are allowed to attend schools across the MCO/CMCO/RMCO areas.



Movement of lecturers/teachers/teaching staff for examination classes is allowed with approval from the Ministry.



Movement in/out of the MCO area for emergencies such as in cases of death & natural disasters.

NGO movement in aiding calamities/humanitarian crisis will require permission from PDRM and the aid is to be extended via Pusat Kawalan Operasi Bencana (PKOB) under NADMA.



Reciprocal Green Lane (RGL) and Periodic Commuting Arrangement (PCA) travel scheme between Malaysia and Singapore will continue.



Childcare centres, nurseries and kindergartens are allowed to operate with the approval to operate from the relevant Ministry/Agency.



Parents/guardians are allowed to send their children to daycare centres based on the capacity of the vehicle.

Only 30% of employees in the management group are allowed to attend. Employers may determine the number of employees while practicing physical distancing and public health protocols at the workplace.

Only a maximum of 3 persons (including the sick patient) may leave the house to receive healthcare services/medical aid within a 10km radius from either their residential place or the nearest medical centre/clinic.



Matriculation colleges are allowed. Students in boarding schools/universities/institutions are allowed to be in the boarding school/university/institution and continue hybrid learning.



International examinations, professional bodies and research activities that require laboratory facilities in Institutions of Higher Education are allowed.

#### Recreational activities:



Jogging is allowed in a group of not more than 2 people only in the neighbourhood.

Group cycling is not allowed.



Individual cycling is allowed within 10km from residential place only.

A total of 5 committee members are allowed to be present to manage mosques/surau and other places of worship.



#### For Friday Prayers

- Federal Territory of Kuala Lumpur, Labuan & Putrajaya - maximum of 30 people allowed
- Penang & Selangor - subject to State Government and State Islamic Religious Authority



#### Hours of Operation

Operations from 6am to 8pm

- Restaurants, shops/food stalls, food trucks, street vendors, mobile vendors, food court/complex, roadside stalls/kiosks, sundry shops and convenience stores
- Only take-away food, drive-throughs or deliveries are allowed for food services
- Shops selling daily necessities (i.e. groceries)
- Animal clinics and shops selling pet food
- Pharmacies
- Laundrettes and self-service laundrettes (provided that one employee is present to monitor and maintain the SOP)

#### Other Hours of Operation:



- 24 hours or according to operating license for hospitals, clinics and medical laboratories



- Petrol stations from 6am - 10pm (Exception: 24 hours for highway stations)



- Daily markets and farmers' markets from 7am - 2pm
- Wholesale markets from 12am - 6am and 11am - 4pm

### Obtaining Approval to Operate

- All sectors in the list of **Essential Services** must register with their relevant Ministry/Agency
- Employee movement is subject to registration/operational approval letter and employee pass/employer confirmation letter
- Movement in relation to Governmental official affairs must be accompanied by an employer confirmation document
- Employee attendance capacity for Essential Services is limited to employees who need to be physically present at the workplace for the purpose of performing duties (note: employers are responsible to make classification to reduce number of people in the workplace)

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GENERAL STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

## PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

### ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES



- Night markets and late night bazaars
- Clothing shops, optometries, barbers, salon, spa and reflexology centres
- Tuition, music, dance, art, Qur'an recital and other types of classes

### ENTERTAINMENT



- Nightclubs/pubs
- Theme parks, indoor playgrounds, family karaoke and cinemas
- Concert activities or live performances

### MEETINGS



- In-person government or private agency meetings involving third party representative agencies may be conducted via video
- All seminars, workshops, courses, trainings, talks, conventions, exhibitions and activities relating to Meeting, Incentives, Conventions and Exhibitions (MICE)

### FESTIVE EVENTS



- Official and unofficial Government and private events
- Social events such as engagements, anniversaries or birthday celebrations, wedding receptions, retreats, reunions and other social activities

### SPORTS ACTIVITIES



- All sports and recreational activities except jogging and individual cycling
- Hosting of sport competitions
- Events and competitions involving international competitors

### TOURISM



- Tourism activity in and out of MCO and Enhanced MCO areas.
- Tourism activity overseas and entry of foreign tourists to Malaysia (except those from specific countries as mentioned by the Minister)
