# ZUL RAFIQUE & partners \*\* OVERTIME UNDER THE 2022 AMENDMENT EMPLOYMENT ACT 1955

- The Employment Act 1955 defines 'overtime' as work carried out in excess of the normal hours of work per day.
- Under the amended First Schedule of Employment Act 1955, employees with wages exceeding RM4,000 are not statutorily entitled to overtime payment.
- Therefore, overtime payment for an employee working in excess of their normal hours of work would only apply to person specified in Paragraph 1 and Paragraph 2 of the First Schedule of the Employment Act 1955, namely where an employee is:
  - earning RM4,000 and below;
  - engaged in a manual labour including artisan or apprentice;
  - engaged in operation and maintenance of mechanically propelled vehicle operated for transport of passengers, goods or etc; or
  - supervising or overseeing other employees engaged in manual labour



# Ordinary Rate of Pay (ORP) & Hourly Rate of Pay (HRP)

#### **ORDINARY RATE OF PAY (ORP)**

Monthly Rate of Pay

#### Illustration

Ahmad earns RM4,000 per month, thus, Ahmad's Ordinary Rate of Pay is:

RM4,000 = RM153.85 per day 26

#### **HOURLY RATE OF PAY**

Monthly Rate of Pay x — 1 8

#### Illustration

Ahmad's ORP is RM153.85 per day and his normal working hours is 8 hours, thus, Ahmad's **Hourly Rate of Pay** is:

$$RM4,000 \times 1 = RM19.23 \text{ per hour}$$

Pursuant to the recent Employment (Amendment) Act 2022, the working hours have now been amended to 45 hours per week.







### HOW TO CALCULATE OVERTIME PAYMENT?

Description	Rate (RM)	Illustrations
Work done on Normal Working Day <b>in excess</b> of normal working hours	HRP x 1.5	Ahmad's working hours is 8 hours per day. He worked overtime for another 3 hours. Ahmad is entitled to his <b>Ordinary Rate of Pay + overtime payment of</b> : $HRP = \underbrace{Monthly\ Rate\ of\ Pay}_{26} \times \underbrace{1}_{26}$ $RM19.23 = \underbrace{RM4,000}_{26} \times \underbrace{1}_{26}$ $26 \qquad 8$ $(RM153.85) + (RM19.23 \times 1.5 \times 3\ hours) = RM240.39$
		(INVISCOS) - (INVISCOS X 1.5 X 5 HOURS) - INVICAGOS
Work done on Rest Day <b>within</b> normal working hours*  *Rate of pay differs for employees employed on a daily, hourly or other similar rate of pay	Half of normal working hours = ORP x 0.5	Ahmad's working hours is 8 hours per day. He worked on Sunday only for 4 hours (half of the normal working hours) Ahmad is <b>entitled to a pay of:</b> ORP = Monthly Rate of Pay 26  RM153.85 = RM4,000 26  RM153.85 x 0.5 = RM76.93
		Ahmad's working hours is 8 hours per day. He worked on Sunday only for 6 hours.
	More than half but does not exceed normal working hours = ORP x 1.0	Ahmad is entitled to a pay of:  ORP = <u>Monthly Rate of Pay</u> 26  RM153.85 = <u>RM4,000</u> 26  RM153.85 x 1.0 = RM153.85







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## HOW TO CALCULATE OVERTIME PAYMENT?

Description	Rate (RM)	Illustrations
Work done on Rest Day <b>in excess</b> of normal working hours	HRP x 2.0	Ahmad's working hours is 8 hours per day. He worked on Sunday (his rest day) and overtime for another extra 3 hours. Ahmad is entitled to his <b>Ordinary Rate of Pay (ORP x 1.0) + overtime payment of (HRP x 2.0):</b> $HRP = \underbrace{Monthly\ Rate\ of\ Pay\ x\ 1}_{26} \qquad 8$ $RM19.23 = \underbrace{RM4,000\ x\ 1}_{26} \qquad 8$ $(RM153.85\ x\ 1.0) + (RM19.23\ x\ 2.0\ x\ 3\ hours) = RM269.23$
Work done during Public Holiday <b>within</b> normal working hours	ORP x 2.0	Ahmad's working hours is 8 hours per day. He worked during National Day Public Holiday for any duration within his normal working hours. Ahmad is entitled to a payment of:  ORP = Monthly Rate of Pay 26  RM153.85 = RM4,000 26  RM153.85 x 2.0 = RM307.70
Work done during Public Holiday <b>in excess</b> of normal working hours	HRP x 3.0	Ahmad's working hours is 8 hours per day He worked the full 8 hours during National Day Public Holiday and overtime for another 3 hours. Ahmad is entitled to his Ordinary Rate of Pay during Public Holiday (ORP x 2.0) + overtime payment of (HRP x 3.0):  HRP = Monthly Rate of Pay x 1 26 8  RM19.23 = RM4,000 x 1 26 8  (RM153.85 x 2.0) + (RM19.23 x 3.0 x 3 hours) = RM480.77
